Grade 2 English Language Arts Course of Study Highland Local Schools

Overview

In Second Grade English Language Arts, instruction is grounded in Ohio's Learning Standards, supporting students as they expand their foundational reading and writing skills and begin to develop greater independence as learners. Students read a variety of literary and informational texts to strengthen comprehension, vocabulary, and fluency. They build decoding and word analysis skills through continued phonics instruction and develop strategies for understanding more complex text structures and language. Writing focuses on organizing ideas clearly in narrative, opinion, and informative formats, while grammar, punctuation, and spelling are taught in context. Through discussions, read-alouds, and written responses, students deepen their understanding of texts, express ideas clearly, and grow as confident communicators.

Phonemic Awareness, Phonics, and Fluency Instruction in Second Grade

Phonemic awareness, phonics, and fluency instruction are key components of early reading success and are aligned with Ohio's Learning Standards. Teachers provide explicit, systematic instruction using the Orton-Gillingham approach through the Institute for Multisensory Education (IMSE), along with continued use of the Heggerty Phonemic Awareness Curriculum to reinforce foundational sound skills. Lessons incorporate multisensory strategies to support all learners, including those with reading challenges, by engaging visual, auditory, and kinesthetic pathways. Students build decoding and encoding skills through structured phonics instruction while developing fluency through repeated reading, phrasing, and expression. This comprehensive approach helps students read with increased accuracy, speed, and comprehension, setting a strong foundation for lifelong literacy.

Reading Vocabulary and Comprehension in Second Grade

Vocabulary and Comprehension instruction are closely connected and intentionally designed to build background knowledge and deepen understanding of text. Teachers use high-quality anchor texts across content areas to introduce new concepts, model thinking strategies, and support students in making meaningful connections. Explicit vocabulary instruction is embedded within these lessons, focusing on teaching high-utility words in context and encouraging students to use them in speaking and writing. Through guided discussions, repeated readings, and purposeful questioning, students strengthen their ability to analyze texts, infer meaning, and explain their thinking. This approach helps students grow as critical readers and confident communicators.

District and State Reading Assessments

In Grade 2, students participate in several key assessments to support their continued growth in reading and language arts. Throughout the year, they take the NWEA MAP Growth Reading (Ohio 2-5) assessment to monitor progress in foundational and advanced literacy skills aligned with Ohio's Learning Standards. The data from these assessments helps guide instruction, target interventions, and support individualized learning. In early spring, students also take the Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT), which evaluates reasoning and problem-solving skills. Results from the CogAT help inform instructional planning and support the identification process for gifted services.
