Grade 3 English Language Arts Course of Study Highland Local Schools

Overview

At Highland Local Schools, third grade English Language Arts instruction is guided by the Ohio's Learning Standards and designed to build strong readers, writers, and thinkers. Core instruction is driven by high-quality anchor texts selected through the *Open-Up Resources Bookworms* curriculum, ensuring rich, diverse literature that supports deep comprehension and meaningful engagement. These anchor texts are used intentionally to build students' background knowledge and develop academic vocabulary in context, helping learners make connections across content areas. Vocabulary instruction is explicit and woven into daily lessons, reinforcing word understanding and usage. Foundational literacy skills are further supported through morphology instruction using the Institute for Multi-Sensory Education (IMSE) Orton-Gillingham approach, with a focus on prefixes, suffixes, base words, and word patterns. This structured approach strengthens decoding, spelling, and vocabulary growth. Through these combined strategies, students become fluent, confident readers and effective communicators prepared for success across all disciplines.

District and State Reading Assessments

In Grade 3, students engage in several assessments to support their reading development and meet state requirements. Throughout the year, they take the NWEA MAP Growth Reading assessment to monitor progress in key literacy skills aligned with Ohio's Learning Standards. This data helps teachers tailor instruction and provide targeted support. In addition, third grade students participate in the Ohio State Reading Assessment in both the fall and spring, as part of the Third Grade Reading Guarantee. This state-mandated assessment measures reading proficiency and helps determine promotion to fourth grade. These tools work together to ensure students receive the support they need to become confident, successful readers.
