

PATHWAYS TO COLLEGE CREDIT

Public institutions of higher education require all students to complete a set of liberal education courses within associate and baccalaureate degrees. These courses are commonly known as the general education requirements. Because of the higher ratio of technical courses required in applied associate degree and technical study degree programs, these types of two-year degrees have a smaller set of general education requirements than other degree programs.

FYE1000 – Academic and Career Success (First Year Experience): This course will orient students to college; introduce the knowledge, skills, and behaviors needed to be a successful college student; and assist with establishing academic, career, and personal goals. Topics include time management, study skills, stress management, information literacy, campus resources, goal setting, academic planning, career exploration. FYE1000 will be an elective in A&S (AA/AS degrees) and will replace the current ASC1000 – Skills for Success course. High school partners can still offer this course and students can enroll both in-person and online.
